



# Architecture 2025 Salary Survey & Guide Mid Year Release

## **Architecture**

#### **Market Overview**

Average salaries have increased in 2025 compared to 2024, reflecting a steady upwards trend in line with candidate expectations and market demand. However, the upper limits of salary bandings have largely remained consistent, suggesting that while demand is strong, firms are still cautious about exceeding established top-end thresholds.

The first half of the year has been relatively subdued in terms of recruitment activity and significant project wins, particularly when compared to previous years. Nonetheless, architecture remains a notably active market, busier than many other sectors across the UK.

Demand continues to be strongest in infrastructure, fit-out, and international projects, much like we saw throughout 2024. This trend shows little sign of shifting in the immediate future. However, with increasing government backing for UK-based infrastructure schemes and evolving planning application reforms, we anticipate a gradual long-term shift in focus towards domestic projects.

Residential and transport hub developments are currently the most active segments, with large-scale commercial schemes also beginning to gain traction. London remains a key centre for international architectural work, particularly in the Middle East, cementing its role as a global design hub.

Hybrid working remains a point of contention across the sector. Employers continue to push for increased office presence, while employees favour flexible arrangements. That said, there has been some progress, with more firms offering compromises, typically based on workload and deadlines, that support flexible hours while reducing home working.

We do not anticipate any major shifts for the remainder of the year. However, all indicators suggest a market moving in a positive direction, with increased activity expected as we look towards the close of 2025.
